## Berkeley Community Theater Classroom Wing

The recently completed classroom wing of the Berkeley Community Theatre boasts beautiful new practice spaces and facilities with state of the art equipment where students engage in a variety of classes, including Hip Hop Studies, Film, Drama Arts & Acting Workshop, Concert Orchestra, and Jazz Ensemble. This is only the first phase of an extensive renovation project. The Little Theatre and the large theater are also scheduled to be modernized.



Connected to the CTE Public Health Pathway, the Growing Leaders class at Willard Middle School is designed to teach entrepreneurial skills through a culinary concentration, including growing and harvesting BUSD garden produce. It is part of the CTE Public Health Pathway.





# **Career Technical Education — Pathways to College and Careers**

Career Technical Education (CTE) is a set of uniquely designed courses that make school relevant and engaging by bringing the outside world into the classroom, now beginning as early as sixth grade.

This year, high school students were able to participate in courses such as Digital Sound Engineering, Robotics Engineering, Design and Fabrication Studio, Law and Social Justice, Advanced Video Production, Public Health, and Emergency Medical Care.



Be A Scientist

Diversifying the STEM Career

Pipeline Initiative

"Be a Scientist" at the middle school level gives 7th graders the chance to explore the scientific method through engaging experiments. Students can later apply the skills they learned in High School CTE pathways such as the Biotechnology Academy or the Design and Fabrication Studio.

This early exposure prioritizes underrepresented student groups in STEM, preparing them for success in the rapidly expanding STEM CTE Pathways at Berkeley High School.

#### ) Digital Sound Engineering

In Digital Sound Engineering at Berkeley High School, students learn industry standard MIDI (Musical Instrument Digital Interface) concepts. Topics include keyboard programming, sound modules, and more.






**BOOKS IN CIRCULATION 2021-22** 

AVG. BOOKS PER STUDENT 30.3









#### Berkeley Unified Offers Lifetime Learning



BUSD welcomes and educates students as young as age two and never stops. Preschool programs nurture physical, cognitive, social and emotional development, and build kindergarten readiness skills in young children. Students at Berkeley Adult School engage in GED programs, learn world languages, and acquire skills like financial planning and much more.

#### **BUSD Students are Climate Scholars**

Across the district, educators are implementing BUSD's 2021 Climate Literacy Resolution, which commits to graduating students who are well versed in climate change science, issues and solutions, and environmental justice

as a civil rights issue. During the 2022-23 school year, elementary students learned about the harms of fossil fuels, middle school students hosted the district's first Earth Day Climate Fair, and high school students hosted a Climate Showcase.



#### African American Success Framework Supports Students Grades K-12

BUSD's AASF provides a comprehensive collection of programs designed to confront and remedy issues in the

district related to serving African American students. Programs include: Black to School, middle and high school transition fairs, College Bound, Young Gifted and



Black, summer STEM Steps for Success, field trips, Umoja, and more.

# AVID and Bridge Prepare Latinx Students for College

Longfellow Middle Schools' AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) program serves students traditionally underrepresented in our universities, arranging college visits and providing specific instruction around note-taking, higher level thinking, and public speaking. At Berkeley High School's Bridge program, 100% of the Class of 2023 are expected to attend college in the fall.
