Deborah Burns-McCloskey and Judith Lunger-Bergh

The District contracts with Ms. Deborah Burns-McCloskey and Ms. Judith Lunger-Bergh who are specialists in Alternative Communication (AAC) and Assistive Technology (AT). AAC is a method of communication used by students with severe speech and language disabilities such as cerebral palsy or autism. Some students are cognitively normal, but unable to use verbal speech. Others are impaired so that speech is extremely difficult to understand.

AT promotes greater independence by enabling the student to perform tasks that he/she has great difficulty accomplishing, by providing enhancements to or changed methods of interacting with the technology needed to accomplish such tasks.

The amount for these services will not exceed \$30,000 for Ms. Burns-McCloskey and \$45,000 for Ms. Lunger-Bergh.

Maxim Health Care

Maxim Health Care provides a nurse for a student who requires constant medical attention. The student is quadriplegic, confined to a wheelchair, has seizure disorder, cerebral palsy, and surgically inserted devices that require regular monitoring and periodic adjustment. During the school day, it is the responsibility of the school district to provide a nurse to ensure the safety of this student. The amount for specialized health care services for this student is not to exceed \$84,000.

The rates negotiated in each agreement were based on SELPA rates for Fiscal Year 2010-2011.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The *2020 Vision* Leadership Planning Team has identified Cultural and Linguistic Relevance as one of the systems investments needed to help the City and the District close the achievement gap in Berkeley USD. Staff is proposing the creation of a new position to lead, direct and coordinate the District's efforts to ensure that our schools and departments are responsive to the cultural and linguistic needs of our students and their families.

During the last few years, BUSD has provided training for teachers in culturally responsive teaching. While this work to improve instruction needs to continue, staff is recommending that we expand our efforts in this area by focusing on improving and creating systems that address the cultural and linguistic needs of all our students, parents and staff. For example, this position could help define a clear pathway to a teaching credential for our classified employees and support participating employees during this process. This was identified as a District goal in the most recent Plan to Close the Achievement Gap, one that the staff was not able to achieve.

The Supervisor of Culturally and Linguistically Responsive Systems will work closely with all schools and departments within BUSD, including classified and certificated employees of color, to support improved systems. A primary responsibility of this position will be to provide training to both certificated and classified staff on educational and service oriented strategies that support cultural and linguistic differences. This position is identified as a management position to give it the authority and level of importance needed for systems change work. It is imperative that the person in this position be viewed with the ability not only to support but also to implement change in systems, programs, and schools.

The cost of the position will be paid with categorical funds and will not impact the General Fund. The position will be multi-funded with Measure A Professional Development funds and Title I, Title II and Title III funds.

A copy of the job description with the proposed classification has been attached.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approximately \$63,000 to \$80,000 for salary and benefits from categorical funds

Background Information:

Staff is proposing to redesign our pre-school and extended day (BEARS) programs in response to the following circumstances.

Currently the State of California has proposed a reduction and change to funding for both pre-school and extended day programs. In addition, the state has proposed a change in the qualification requirements for eligible students. Based on the current proposals before the legislature, it will be more difficult for students to qualify for full day pre-school although half-day (3 hour) programs will continue to serve students including those who have parents who are not seeking employment or attending school. There has been no proposal at the state level to terminate the 3 hour State Pre-School program.

In addition to the proposed changes from the state, it should be noted that the pre-school program has not been able to earn sufficient income to meet its expenditures during the past few years. The pre-school program has relied on excess earnings in the BEARS program to meet its financial obligations, and the proposed state budget would eliminate BEARS.

The proposed reconfiguration will:

- Address the changes in qualifications proposed by the state
- Expand the number of 3 hour Pre-School classrooms and create 6.5 hour and 9.5 hour Pre-School classrooms but not continue the current 10.5 hour program
- Continue to serve approximately the same number of pre-school students
- Ensure each program is fiscally sound

This proposal will require negotiations with our unions to implement, as it may result in a change in program for some staff.

CDE Contract Changes

In order to expand the Pre-School program we have rewritten our state contract and requested a change from the CDE (see additional Board item). We have requested a shift of \$250,000 from our extended day program (CCTR) to our Pre-School child development contract (CSPP). This will result in a total Pre-School budget of \$3.2 million dollars and reducing the extended day

contract to \$2 million dollars. The CDE is supportive of this proposal. (If BEARS funding is eliminated, the District will find another funding source, such as the newly approved federal stimulus money.)

Proposed new Pre-School program design

BUSD Pre-Schools will provide the following programs for students and parents beginning Sept. 1st:

- Add two more 3-hour State Pre-School classes: 190 days of classes, 3 hours per day, 2 sessions for each teacher per day
- Create six 6.5 hour Pre-School classes: 240 days, up to 6.5 hours per day
- Eliminate all 10.5 hour Pre-School classes
- Create four 9.5 hour Pre-School classes: 240 days, up to 9.5 hours per day
- Maintain Special-Education classrooms including the Integrated Program and the Full Inclusion Program

This proposal will allow us to serve approximately 398 students starting in September compared to 392 currently.

Proposed BEARS program

In reviewing the existing BEARS programs that exist at eight sites, along with the capacity of Berkeley LEARNS to expand its support to our after school students, we determined the following:

- Three existing school sites will require BEARS programs to continue to serve all students in need; existing LEARNS programs at these sites are at capacity.
- Two school sites have the capacity to absorb additional students in LEARNS, but this is not sustainable over the long term. We will look at ongoing funding for these sites after the budget is finalized, adding BEARS classrooms if full funding of the contract is approved.
- Three school sites with existing LEARNS programs have the capacity to absorb all BEARS students in the LEARNS program.

Staff is proposing to open the school year serving the students with a minimal program where the needs are greatest (3 sites), thus reducing earned income by approximately 1 million dollars of the contract:

- Jefferson Elementary: 1 classroom
- Malcolm X: 2 classrooms
- Muir: 1 before school program only

As the budget outlook is clarified and the state budget is approved, we will pursue expanding the BEARS program to meet our full contract and add additional classrooms to support students. This would include a summer program in 2011. This proposal will not provide sufficient funding to BEARS to earn its full contract in 2010-11. It is possible that the state will permanently reduce our BEARS contract if we do not meet it this year.

Current Fiscal Outlook:

• On July 1, 2010, BUSD transferred Pre-K/BEARS reserves to create the 2010-11 budget in an effort to allow the programs to continue despite the lack of an approved state budget.	\$800,000
• The district also contributed unexpected K-12 ADA revenue from 2009-10 to the pre-K/BEARS budget to help bridge the gap until the budget is approved.	\$300,000
• Carry over funds from the 2009-10 Child Development budget are expected to be added at fiscal closing.	\$100,000
• State Pre-School Funds: The state has not proposed cutting the 3 hour State Pre-School funding, and we are able to earn/utilize those funds to run our program. This amount reflects an increase from 1 to 3 half-day classrooms with income beginning Sept. 1.	\$144,000

The BEARS summer expenses appear lower than usual as the District was able to support a portion of the summer program with categorical funds for at risk students, including some unused district Title I Supplemental Educational Services, Title III English Learner funds, and Summer School funding.

Fiscal Impact of Proposed Changes:

The cost for the proposed pre-k program, beginning on Aug. 30th will be \$265,000 per month. The cost for the BEARS program will be \$36,000 for the proposed reduced program.

This proposal, if approved, will need to be reexamined as soon as there is a state budget approved and no later than October 31st. The District may need to reduce further or eliminate certain programs.

FISCAL IMPACT

This proposal allows funding of the proposed program through Oct. 31st. It requires a contribution from the district of \$38,000. After Oct. 31st it requires a contribution of \$301,000 per month to continue to operate.

1. Identify the program component for which you are requesting a change.

We are requesting to change our program to serve more part time families, 3 hours, and open up kindergarten readiness classes for our four and five year olds who will be attending kindergarten in the fall 2011. To be able to expand and change our current CSPP contract we will also have to change our CCTR and shift out of this contract into the CSPP.

At the preschool level we have three different programs; two state preschool classes (3 hours each), fourteen full time classes (ten hours each), and three special education integrated classes. We are requesting to add four more half day classes to equal six state preschools. We are also requesting to reduce our fourteen full time classes to ten full time classes.

We currently do not have age eligible classes for our four and five year olds who will be entering kindergarten in the fall and focusing on kindergarten readiness skills. This is a great opportunity to focus on opening one kindergarten readiness classroom at each site. The kindergarten readiness program would be a six in a half hour program. Parents whose work or school needs require a greater number of hours of care will be accommodated.

2. Describe how the program currently provides services to children and families in relation to the above-identified program component.

The program we currently have in BUSD is at three preschool sites where we offer our services to eligible families.

At the preschool level we offer fourteen full day classes/care and a two half time programs. The full time program is open from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm. The half time program is open from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm and 12:30 pm to 3:30 pm.

The program we are providing provides a continuity of services and prepares children and families for elementary schools. The families get to know with the district and they also get exposed to curriculum they will encounter at the elementary level. In the full time classrooms we currently provide three meals, nap time, and intense instruction based on the DRDP-R and ECERS with guidance of Creative Curriculum.

The full time program operates for 240 days and our part time program is open for 190 days.

3. Describe the proposed change, and how services will be improved if the change is implemented.

The proposed reconfiguration will allow us to:

- Address the changes in qualifications proposed by the state
- Expand the number of State Pre-School classrooms and pre-school students served
- Ensure the program is fiscally sound
- Provide space for an additional special education classroom

We will request a shift from our school age program (CCTR) to our pre-school child development contract (CSPP) by \$141,464. This will result in a total pre-K budget of \$3,132,924 reducing the extended day contract (CCTR) to \$2,136,386.

BUSD Pre-Schools will provide the following programs for students and parents beginning Sept. 1st:

- State Pre-School: 190 days of classes, 3 hours per day, 2 sessions for each teacher per day

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The staff at Berkeley High School is recommending the adoption of the text, *Forensic Science for High School Students* for the new Community Partnerships Academy forensic science course.

Forensic Science for High School Students, by John Funkhouser and Barbara Ball-Deslich and published by Kendall/Hunt, is designed to teach problem solving with forensic science as the medium. This textbook provides forensic science content with a creative, hands-on approach that engages students in thought-provoking cases and scenarios that require them to take what they have learned and apply it to new situations. Students experience forensic science first hand through exercises, data gathering, problem solving and critical thinking. They get to practice science as inquiry, and to apply the scientific method – observation, collection, classification of data, looking for relationships, forming a hypothesis, testing it, and then advancing a conclusion or opinion. Students must then be prepared to defend conclusions based on their own empirical evidence. This text is designed to work well for a variety of reading levels, to be easily integrated with social science, English, government or other courses, and it is ideally suited to cooperative learning teaching strategies.

The textbook and the course outline are on display in the Superintendent's Conference Room. The book will be brought to the Board meeting on September 15, 2010 for official adoption.

- 3) All classes should be taught by properly credentialed teachers.
- 4) Students who have not passed the California High School Exit Exam by the end of grade 12 should be provided the opportunity to receive intensive instruction and services after completion of grade 12 for up to two consecutive years.

Information about the standards is posted in every classroom along with the complaint procedure to follow if there is a concern that any one of them is not being met.

- 1 During the last quarter, between April 1 and June 30, 2010, the district received two facilities complaints: one regarding the newly re-opened Annex Building at Longfellow Middle School, which noted an odor affecting an employee's breathing, and one regarding a girl's restroom at King Middle School. All of the conditions noted were investigated and corrected as deemed necessary.
- 2 During this same period, the district received no complaints under the Williams Case Settlement regarding instructional materials, properly credentialed teachers, or CAHSEE support for students who have completed grade 12.
