BHS/ EL Program

We have our ELD newcomer program, which targets students who have been in the US 5 years or less. Within the newcomer program at BHS our students are enrolled in ELD and SDAIE (Specially Designed Academic Instruction in English) classes.

For ELD, we currently have 4 double period ELD courses for newcomers:

ELD 1/2 combination class (beginning / early intermediate)

ELD 3 (early intermediate / intermediate)

ELD 4 (called Literature of Diversity & Expository Writing)

ELD 5 (called SDAIE World Literature & SDAIE Writing)

SDAIE classes also target our newcomer ELD population. The SDAIE content classes are for newcomer ELD students and provide grade level content with language supports.
