Proclaiming February 2016 as
National African American History Month

WHEREAS, the struggle against racism continues here in Berkeley as well as the rest of the world, Berkeley Unified School District has demonstrated a commitment to promoting education and community conversation on racial injustice, including the recently held African American Town Hall Meeting, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education encourages discussions, presentations, and projects relating to and enhancing the experience of African American History month; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that on this 10th day of February 2016, February 2016 be declared African American Month in the Berkeley Unified School District.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be distributed to all school sites and given a prominent place on the District's website.
