

Ms. Sawyer joined BUSD in 2011. She directs the Symphonic Band at Willard as well as teaches beginning instrumental music at several Berkeley elementary schools. When Ms. Sawyer is not teaching, she enjoys performing with her brass quintet, Tamalpais Brass and traveling to Scandinavia.

Henry Viets: Pulled into 5th grade band by his best friend many, many years ago, Henry had no idea what marvelous things were going to unfold later in his musical life. Besides playing horn with the Santa Rosa Symphony since 1986, he has performed with many groups in the Bay Area. One of his highlights was playing with his childhood idol Doc Severinsen. Besides being conductor of the Mighty Willard Orchestra, Henry teaches brass and strings at numerous elementary schools.

She has studied Music Education, Jazz Studies, and Arts Administration from Michigan State University, the University of North Texas, and Columbia University. Melissa continues to be an active freelance performer and can be seen with the Kelly Park Big Band, the SFJazz Monday Night Band, and with the DuPre Saxophone Quartet.
