ACDPH Elementary Waiver Application

BUSD completed the first step of the elementary waiver application process - the "In Person Learning Questionnaire". We indicated our interest in both options for school reopening:

- 1. Elementary Waiver
- 2. Targeted, Cohort-Based Support for Vulnerable Learners

We received the elementary waiver application on Thursday, September 10. It was originally due on September 18, and this deadline has been extended for public school districts to October 2.

The waiver application has 54 elements for districts to complete.

- 4. Youth Activities Sports Conditioning, Internships, Poll Workers

How BUSD Will Move Forward in Each of These Areas

As state and local guidance is adjusted:

- 3. Close Assessment of BUSD's Health Practices
- 4. Communication with Staff
- 5. Staff and Administrator Training
- 6. School Recommendations of Students
- 7. Small, Careful Pilot Efforts
