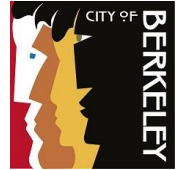
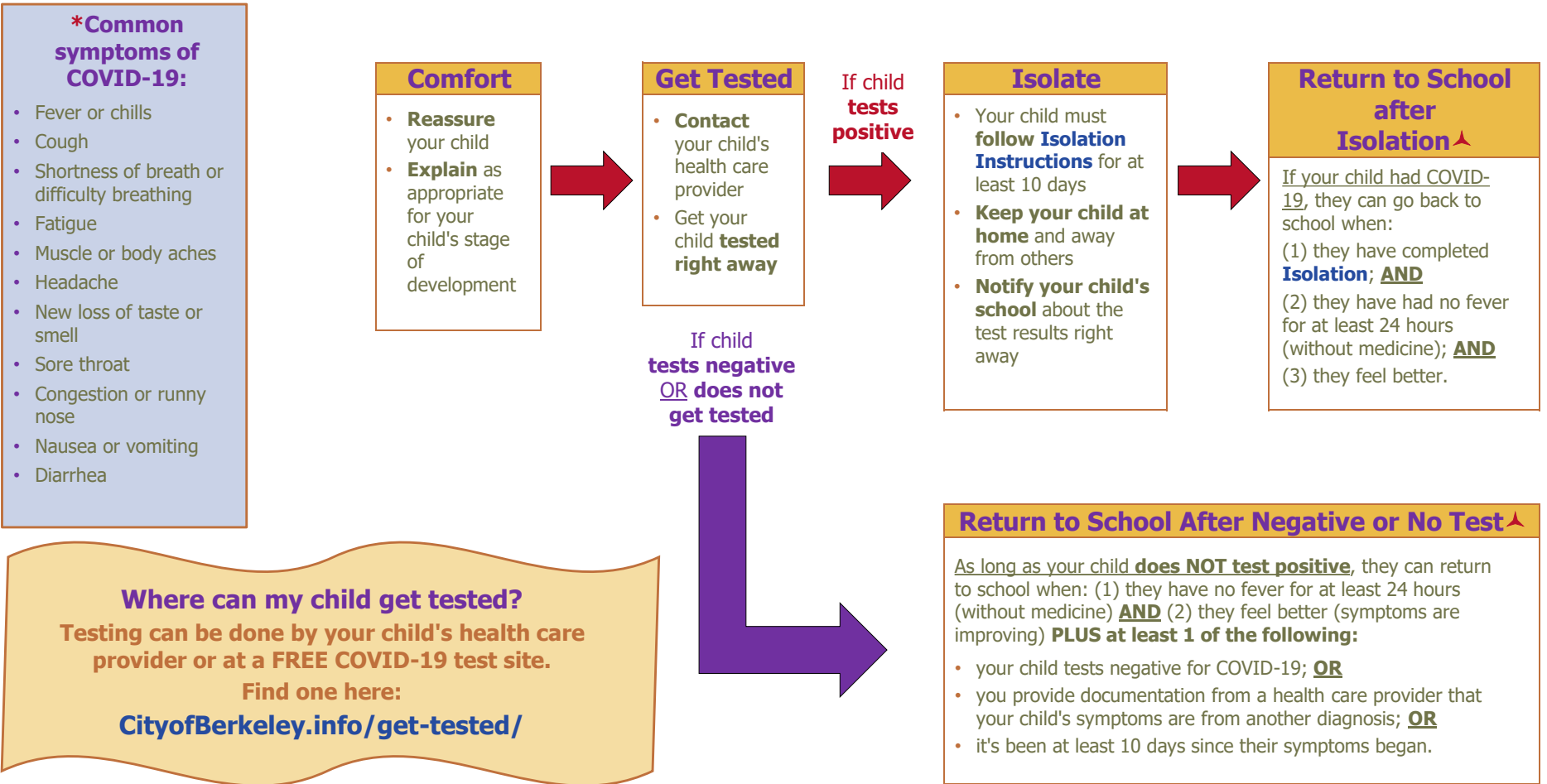

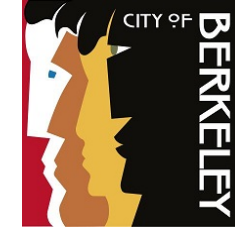


What do I do if my child has COVID-19 symptoms* with no known exposure? (applies to **VACCINATED** and **UNVACCINATED** children)

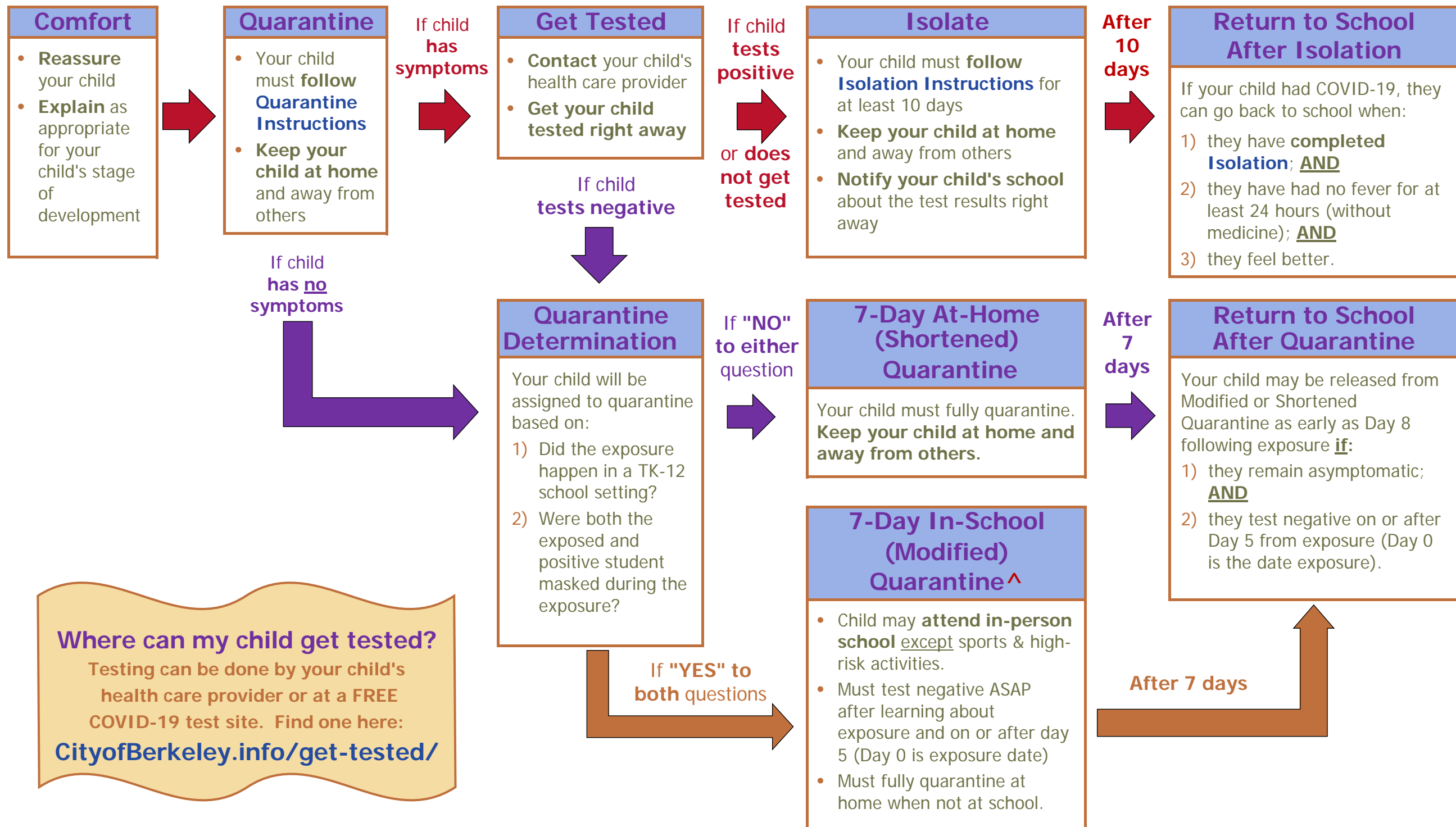


⚠ Check school/program policy before sending your child back.

What do I do if my UNVACCINATED child was a "close contact"* of someone who tested positive for COVID-19?



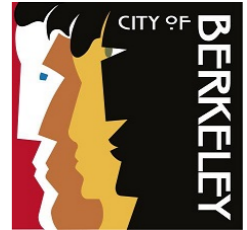
If your child develops any symptoms or tests positive at any point in this process, isolate immediately.



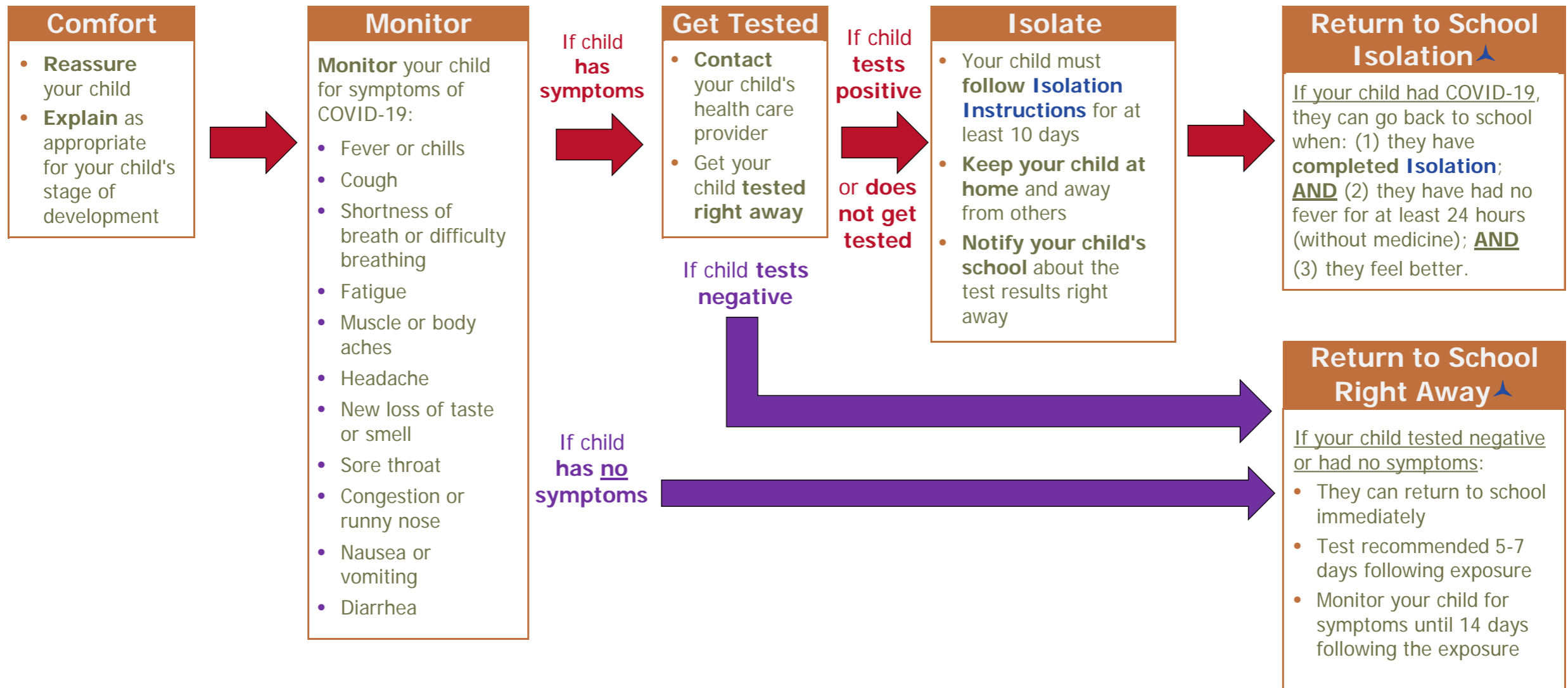
* A **close contact** is a person who spent at least 15 minutes within 6 feet of someone with COVID-19, all at once or cumulatively, over a 24-hour period while the person was infectious. A person with COVID may be **infectious** from 2 days before they exhibit symptoms or test positive until 10 days after.

[^] Modified quarantine is only available at K-12 Schools. Not all schools offer modified quarantine as an option.

What do I do if my **VACCINATED** child was a "close contact" * of someone who tested positive for COVID-19?



If your child develops any symptoms or tests positive at any point in this process, isolate immediately.

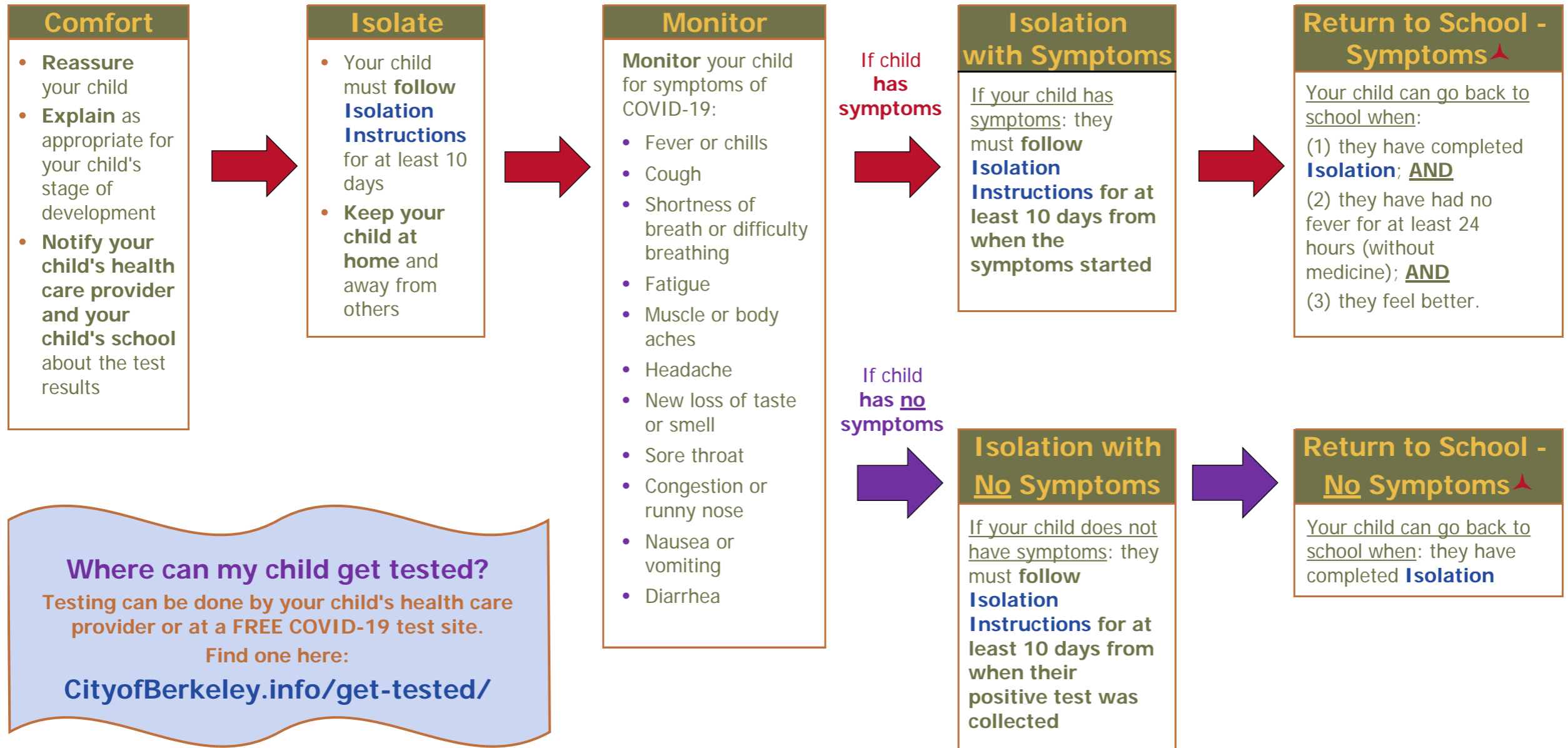
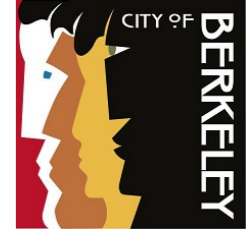
